
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

- make referrals to the DBS

The session is mainly targeted to those who have a responsibility for removing individuals from regulated activity posts where harm has, or may, occur, with special emphasis on the barring functions of the DBS.

- background to the DBS and legislative changes
- the statutory functions of the DBS
- disclosure certificates and eligibility criteria
- referral responsibilities and guidance
- regulated activity, relevant conduct and risk of harm definition and the DBS barring decision making processes and considerations

It will provide detailed guidance on the duty to refer, submission of referrals and the information required to support a referral to the DBS, allowing for questions and the opportunity to comment.

This session will help employers and managers of volunteers understand their legal obligations and responsibilities, following safeguarding incidents.

Details: To introduce a new joint venture which combines the expertise of staff from the Building Bridges Project which offers counselling to adults who's mental health is impacting on their ability to parent, and that of the Hope Project, who offer a variety of therapeutic interventions to children and families post abuse (free from violence) and deemed to be in "recovery". The "Whole Families" model requires the input of a qualified social worker with experience of working with children who have been subjected to DA, and that of a qualified practitioner with experience in counselling/working with parents (over the age of 18) where safeguarding concerns exist. Staff will be working with couples where intimate partner violence persists, and where children continue to live in dangerous environments. The emphasise of the work being undertaken revolves around Risk Assessment and Safety Planning as part of a family support package which may or may not include the services of other Organisations and Agencies.




